



The firt of Mile

The Cross of Peace

This four-meter-high cross, mounted on an anti-tank barrier made from railway rails produced at the Azovstal plant in Mariupol, is constructed from metal salvaged from destroyed residential buildings in Kharkiv and Odesa—places where entire families were killed by Russian missile strikes.

For the first time since 1054—the year of the Great Schism—the ends of the cross are designed in the styles of Catholicism, Orthodoxy, and Protestantism.

At the heart of the "Cross of Peace" installation is a crucified figure of Christ composed of 20,000 tiny fragments of artillery shells and mines, gilded in 999.9 fine gold.

Pope Francis, moved by this work of art, called on all Christians worldwide to celebrate Easter on the same day.

For the First Time in the History of Art

The monumental art installation "The Cross of Peace," featuring a golden crucifix, is traveling through dozens of cities and towns across Ukraine as part of a global presentation of this unique creation.

For the first time ever, a one-ton sculpture is being exhibited in the central squares of cities under daily missile and drone attacks—a bold cultural mission unfolding amid an ongoing war.

This unprecedented journey stands as a testament to the power of art to inspire peace, resilience, and unity, even in the darkest of times.







The Holy Mandylion

This sculptural representation of the biblical parable "The Holy Mandylion" is created from thousands of fragments of artillery shells and mines.

The base beneath the face of Christ is shaped like a stylized cloth—the towel with which Jesus wiped His face on the way to Golgotha—and is made from

the metal of 30mm shell casings.

The "towel" is gilded with 999.9 fine gold. **Dimensions:** $70 \times 60 \text{ cm} (27.5 \times 23.6 \text{ inches})$

Ukrainian Phoenix

This striking sculpture is crafted from artillery shell fragments collected across Ukraine. To form the wings and tail of the mythical bird, the artist selected shard-like elements reminiscent of feathers, imbuing the Phoenix with powerful symbolism of rebirth and

At the sculpture's base lies a ruptured shell, from which the immortal bird appears to rise—a poignant representation of a nation ascending from the ashes of war. The piece will be finished with a 999.9 fine gold coating, applied through electroplating.

The Great Coat of Arms of Ukraine

A video by the National News Agency of Ukraine, "Ukrinform," documents the solemn consecration of the "Great Coat of Arms of Ukraine" sculpture, which took place on November 1, 2023, at St. Volodymyr Cathedral in Kyiv.

In central Kyiv, against a backdrop of destroyed Russian military equipment, the sculpture was photographed for the legendary "National Geographic" magazine.

A Masterpiece of the Century for the Chechen People

This sculpture, representing the national emblem of the Chechen Republic of Ichkeria, was created from fragments of artillery shells and 5,000 small arms casings.

Sergey Melnikoff, together with Ukraine's third President, Viktor Yushchenko, presented this unique artwork to Prime Minister Akhmed Zakayev as a symbol of the Ukrainian people's deep gratitude for Chechnya's support in the fight against Russian aggression.

The Great Eagle of Albania

As an official gift to Albania, Sergey Melnikoff created a sculptural depiction of the majestic double-headed eagle, meticulously crafted from fragments of mines and shells.

This sculpture, echoing the form of the national emblem and aptly titled "The Splendid Eagle of Albania," symbolizes the profound bond forged in wartime.

The work was created as part of the International Rehabilitation Center project for Ukrainian children in Albania — a sanctuary for those who lost limbs due to brutal Russian bombings.



The Cross — Voice of the Land

Created in 2025 from fragments of artillery shells collected in Kherson and Mykolaiv, this cross embodies Ukraine's pain, dignity, and resilience.

Crafted in the Catholic tradition and coated

Crafted in the Catholic tradition and coated in nickel, it transforms the metal of war into a symbol of hope and spiritual renewal.

Through it, the "voice of the land" speaks — remembering the fallen and believing in peace.




The Small Coat of Arms of Ukraine


This unique version of the Small Coat of Arms of Ukraine, created from fragments of mines and shells, is presented as an official gift to sponsors who significantly contribute to the children's rehabilitation center project.

Each piece is one-of-a-kind, accompanied by a laser-engraved certificate of authenticity mounted on a base of fine wood.

One of these coats of arms was presented by the artist to President Volodymyr Zelenskyy, as well as to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the State Border Guard Service of Ukraine.







Who Is MFF?

Sergey Melnikoff — known as MFF — is a National Hero of the Chechen Republic of Ichkeria for his personal contributions to the informational resistance against Russia.

He is a full cavalier of all grades of the Ukrainian Order of Saint Equal-to-the-Apostles Prince Volodymyr the Great and the recipient of numerous international honors.

A descendant of an ancient Ukrainian Cossack lineage, Melnikoff was a Soviet dissident and political prisoner who daringly escaped the USSR with his wife and infant daughter. Today, he is a celebrated American artist and a pioneer of revolutionary photographic techniques.

In 2014, alongside the legendary academician **Borys Paton**, he founded "The Soul of Ukraine," an international charitable foundation.

Melnikoff is the only photographer in history whose works have been accepted as personal gifts by world figures such as U.S. President **George Bush**, Queen **Elizabeth II**, Pope **Francis I**, King **Birendra** of Nepal, the **14th Dalai Lama**, Pope **Benedict XVI**, and many others.

His public artistic face is His Holiness the 14th Dalai Lama, Nobel Peace Prize laureate.



Melnikoff has worked in 150 countries across all continents and is one of the top ten most influential figures in contemporary art. His cinematographic achievements include directing "Hour of Adventures," "Treasure Hunters," and "There Is No Place in the World for Wild Animals."

He even persuaded Tajik President Emomali Rahmon to rename the second-highest peak in the Pamirs from "Korzhenevskaya" to "Ozodi Peak" (Freedom) in 2020.

He is also the author of "The Genius," the world's first Al-generated portrait of a living person — depicting academician Borys Paton.

Melnikoff's accolades affirm his status as one of the most highly decorated and influential artists of our time.
